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Re: Minutes of EAA Chapter 79 Business Meeting October 10, 2014.

1. The gathering began at 1800. Approximately 42 members and guests gathered for bar-b-cued hamburgers at the EAA clubhouse.
2. EAA Chapter 79 President Jack Hohner called the meeting to order at 1905 with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Walley Ware.
3. Jack announced the program for the evening would be Sheldon Burt and Jack Hohner recounting their experiences on the set of Z Nation, a television series airing at 2200 Friday nights on cable. Program nine centers around trying to get a character named Murphy, the only survivor of a zombie bite, to the hospital to use his blood in making an anti-zombie serum. Sheldon's Zenith 701 was used in the hit series' episode to transport Murphy. Sheldon also acted as technical advisor on the aviation portion of the filming.
4. Jack asked for visitors to stand and be recognized. Pete Peters said he is moving to Spokane from Alaska, and has a PA-12 project he will be working on. Elaine McAvoy said they are retired and traveling around looking for a place to call home. They visit EAA chapters in each town they visit.
5. Jack ask for project updates. Gene Soper said he is working on a pusher once owned by Skeeter Carlson. The aircraft has been taxied, but not flown. Jack's Heath is nearly ready to fly. He has run the engine and it sounds good. He needs a new weight and balance. His C-172 needs the engine rebuilt and that is in the works. Walt Ayers is continuing work on his Loving's Love and while he won't speculate, hopes to complete the project within the next year.
6. The EAA 79 meeting minutes from September 12 were approved as posted on the EAA 79 Web site.
7. Treasurer Clark Taylor was not able to attend, but sent word that there is \$10, 500 in the treasury. Jack mentioned that the Friday evening bar-b-cues are bringing in \$25 to \$75 per week, and that every little bit helps.
8. Jack told members that the AOPA Fly-In August 16th brought in over \$3,090 to the EAA 79 treasury - \$2,000 for the use of the EAA building, \$1090 from the breakfast and drink tents and about \$400 from what was sold in the lounge. He thanked all the volunteers who worked all day on cooking sausage and pancakes, selling drinks to the thirsty crowd, staffing the Pilots' Lounge and helping out with 1000 details no one had foreseen. Spokane's version of the AOPA Fly-In was deemed a resounding

success by AOPA representatives, EAA National, and everyone who planned, attended or took part in the event.

9. Jack said the club is hoping to have the EAA B-17 return to Spokane during the summer of 2015. He said the EAA also has a new Ford Tri-Motor which will be kept on the West coast, and that may also visit Spokane in 2015.
10. Jack told members that Matt Perroux has completed Tyler Voss's RV-8, the bill of sale has been located and he is waiting for a new registration from the FAA. The aircraft will then be flown to Texas and turned over to Tyler's parents.
11. There will be a Halloween Party in the lounge Friday, October 31, and the EAA Christmas Party is set for Friday, December 12 at the Elks' Lodge on Robie in the Spokane Valley. Jack reminded members that one of the main events at the Christmas Party is an auction which helps with the treasury. He requested that members start gathering items for the auction.
12. Jack drew members' attention to the EAA Bulletin Board in the meeting room, and told members Renee had worked on organizing items displayed on the board. He said members need to take items down when they are no longer relevant, and that the board will be checked every six months, December and June, for currency.
13. Jack said an Eagle Scout named Will Harpel wants to complete the flight simulator started years ago by club members. Club members discussed the possibility of having a simulator in which time can be logged.
14. Thursday, October 16, there will be a composite workshop at the CDA Airport put on by Merdol Cameron.
15. The business meeting adjourned at 1952, followed by a 15-minute break, and the program by Sheldon Burt and Jack Hohner.
